Congratulations to the 'Happy Haggis' team who won the quiz and commiserations to 'Up & Atom' who came second by just one point.




The 'Bonnie-Wick Parton's' won the prize for the Best Dressed Table and Mr Cooper leaped out in front to win the origami Frog Race.
