This after the hottest of summer heatwaves when the gardens and grounds were parched. The grass has barely recovered. Whilst the sunken garden and borders are slowly being restored to their resplendant best. We are doing all we can to improve the situation, even exploring how to finally obtain a lasting football and cricket pitch, given the wear and tear both endure throughout the year - more on that to follow. Martin has been replaced by the formidable double act of Luke and Liam and run out the bunting, we've been re-joined by Ted who has quite recently been able to increase his hours, which is very good news. To Peter Wilkinson our treasurer, who continues to run the accounts scrupulously and accurately. He had another strong audit this year and we are all now ready for the big Bank Holiday open day.
